

TRYING TO KEEP THE SANCTITY MASK ON.

Paris, October 23.—President Roosevelt has cabled to Ambassador McCormick, designating Secretary Vignaud, of the American Embassy, to represent the United States at the Congress for the Suppression of the "White Slave trade," which opened here yesterday. The primary object of the congress is to secure the effective co-operation of the various national committees, especially for the protection of emigrant women at the ports, and also uniformity in legislation providing for the punishment of traffickers in "white slave."

The delegates to the congress during the afternoon were received in a body by President Fallieres, who highly comended the work they had undertaken. Subsequently, each of the delegates was personally presented to the President.
