

## MISDEEDS AND MISHAPS.

For the past few nights the oil and gas lamps in different parts of the city have not been lighted, leaving the residents in perfect darkness.

On Monday night the grocery store of Mr. Taylor, at the corner of Erato and Howard streets, was entered by some unknown thieves, who carried off about \$25 worth of groceries. The thief entered the premises by means of a window over the shed of the grocery.

Christopher Davis, the lamp trimmer of the steamship Herschel, was knocked into the hold of the vessel by a sling while passing near the hatchway at 8 o'clock yesterday morning. Davis fell on a pile of grain and escaped with a dislocated shoulder blade.

At half-past 12 o'clock on the morning of the 1st inst. J. F. Cobes, a German carpenter, was arrested by Patrolmen Saigeon and Rey, of the Third Precinct, for being drunk on Royal, near Customhouse street. On their way to the station Cobes claims that the two officers robbed him of \$30, and yesterday he complained to the Chief, and was told to make affidavit and charges against the officers.

A boy named Albert Musgrove while running after a street car at the corner of Esplanade and Grand Route St. John, at 7 o'clock yesterday morning, fell and fractured his left arm. Dr. Souchon attended the boy at his residence, No. 108 Grand Route St. John.

Sidney Fazan fell off a Pontchartrain Railway train at 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon, at the corner of Elysian Fields and Marais streets, and was slightly injured about the left leg.
