



F.S.J.N.A.'s \$100 Grant Program

CONDITIONS

The following provides the conditions which must be met to receive \$100 grant toward the purchase and installation of a new HD security camera which would be monitored by Project NOLA.

- Purchase of the camera must be made after March 31, 2014 and a copy of the receipt must be provided.
- Applicants must be homeowners with an internet connection residing within the boundaries of the Faubourg St. John Neighborhood and a current member of the Faubourg St. John Neighborhood Association in good standing.
- There is no requirement to purchase equipment from Project NOLA
- Camera quality must meet or exceed the following criteria and be capable of being monitored by Project NOLA. The camera must be a minimum of 1.3 Mega-Pixel, High Definition IP cameras and have excellent night capability. * Vivotek FD8134V * Vivotek IP8332
- These HD cameras must be directed toward public spaces, streets and sidewalks. Cameras which have an obstructed view or are mounted too high will not be eligible. The intent of the HD cameras is to observe faces, license plates and details which would assist in the identification process.
- The HD camera can be part of a larger system
- It is encouraged but not required that a NVR/DVR recorder be part of the system. During hurricane Isaac when internet connections were lost recorders were still able to capture images. Home owners will also be able to scan their images many days into the past.
- These grants will be distributed on a first come first serve basis. While the date of equipment purchase is considered it is the date the camera becomes available and images are being collected by Project NOLA that will determine eligibility.
- This money for these grants has been provided to the FSJNA by residents and businesses of Faubourg St. John and is in no way associated with Project NOLA. It is simply intended to produce further video monitoring of the public areas of the Faubourg St. John neighborhood.
- It is entirely at the discretion of the FSJNA board and its Crime Camera group to determine if the intent of this grant has been met by the applicant.
