I. With a quorum present, a Call to Order by Greg Jeanfreau was at 6:46pm.

III. Explanation of Meeting Rules, G. Jeanfreau then stated that

IV. Guests

. Captain Scott – Fairgrounds Patrol, in the last month there was one armed robbery at Ursulines and Broad at the bus stop. He reminded the group that the patrol can respond to noise and suspicious activity. He manned all shifts this month except for two. He recommended a traffic study for the speeding problems at Grand route St. John and recalled that we tickets were written for the street, many were issued to neighbors.

. Quality of Life Officer Ken Gill and Christie Lavigne spoke first, and of the lack of complaints in the Faubourg St. John. L. Landesberg express a concern of run down or blights properties from N. White to Broad. C. Abadie and Captain Scott discussed a rental that has received a number of noise complaints. They can be reached directly at 658-6371. Jim Danner raised the recent incidents of an individual knocking on a (neighborhood) door in the middle of the night.

. Half Shell – 3101 Esplanade. With Alicia Plummer (504-458-5809)/ aliciaplummeratt.net), a representative of the owners, and the owners presented a plan for a full service restaurant that would be open 6am – 10pm. They intend to attempt to have a full liquor license. In response to a question, they have no relationship to the previous restaurant (Creole Cottage). The owner had a previous

restaurant that he recently sold. They have applied and expect to be in business by late August to early September. They have a two year lease with two five year options. Jim Danner requested refrigeration for post meal seafood items to minimize the smell. They would like to also have live entertainment.
